## GUIDELINES FOR QUESTIONS IN

## SOCIAL SCIENCE

## **General Instructions:**

- 1. Questions should be well worded and self explanatory.
- 2. Language of the questions should be simple and clear.
- 3. Questions should be based on the content matter of the prescribed text books.
- 4. Terminology should be used from the text books only.
- 5. Directional words should be specific and assessable.

For example:

Discuss features of federalism.

Suggested Version: - What did Martin Luther speak in praise of print? Explain.

- 6. As for as possible the required value points should be inbuilt in the question itself.
- As for as possible the multiple choice questions should have a rationale behind accepting or rejecting an alternative.
- 8. Questions should be prepared strictly in accordance to the design and blue print.
- 9. Questions prepared must bear the same serial number as given in the blue print
- 10. The Map question will contain the following three components
  - i. Question for identification (3 items)
  - ii. Question for Locating and Labelling (3 items)
  - iii. A seprate question for visually handicapped in lieu of the map question based on the same items.
- 11. The four alternatives of the multiple choice question should be strictly denoted by a, b, c, d, within brackets.
- 12. The difficulty level of questions should be as follows:
  - a) Easy questions -
  - b) Average questions 50%
  - c) Difficult questions 20%
- 13. Questions should cover the objectives of knowledge, understanding and application.

14. If a question has two or more than two parts, the marks awarded to each part should be indicated seprately.

For example: 1+2=3
